BREAST FRIENDS SUTTON COLDFIELD, TRUSTEES REPORT YEAR END 30TH APRIL 2009



The Breast Friends Breast Cancer Support Charity has continued to meet its objectives to provide ongoing practical and emotional support to breast cancer patients and to promote breast awareness in the community.

Receipts from donations and fund-raising totalled £78, 841, which was an increase of over 10% on last year. Our grateful thanks go to those who helped us raise this money despite the recession starting to bite.

However, payments for the year totalled £89, 773, which was an overall increase of approx 30% on last year's figures. The need for direct practical help has escalated with an increase of over 100% on provision of home help and laundry and a 250% increase in the provision of equipment which covers electrically operated chairs, wheelchairs and the rental of stair lifts for seriously ill patients.

As the charity is a self help organization run entirely by unpaid volunteers who have all been diagnosed with cancer our administration costs remain low totalling just £3,466 for the year.

During the year, with the help of the National Federation of Healers (non religious) and our own volunteers, the Charity started to offer healing to breast cancer patients on Monday evenings at Good Hope Hospital. This is a free service to patients and the service is offered free of charge by the healers. The Charity is very grateful to those involved as the service as been of significant benefit to patients who have had the healing.

Breast Friends Committee Members continue to promote breast awareness by giving talks to local women's groups and breast awareness is also promoted when fund-raising at local supermarkets and other outlets. The fact that men can also be diagnosed with breast cancer is also mentioned.

Through our help-line and the presence of our volunteers at the clinics in local hospitals the Charity continues to offer emotional help to patients recently diagnosed and those who have had a recurrence.

We take this opportunity to thank the health professionals, in the community and in the local hospitals, who work closely with us informing us of patients in need of our help.

The Charity is very grateful to the local community, which gives ongoing financial support to Breast Friends, without which we could not continue our work.

We are aware that our outgoings have exceeded our incomings this year by approx 13% and the need for our help is escalating so our aim for the forthcoming year is to increase our fund-raising and hope for the continued support of the community despite the difficult financial situation we are all living with.
